



ACP Readiness Checklist: Questions Every VBC Leader Should Be Asking

Do we know which members are most in need of ACP right now — and how to reach them?

- Do we have a scalable, repeatable way to invite them into ACP — digitally, by phone, and through care teams?



Are our ACP workflows scalable, equitable, and integrated into daily care or are they still dependent on heroic individuals?

- When a crisis hits at 2 a.m., can any clinician quickly see what matters most to that patient?
- Are ACP conversations and documents accessible to families, shared across settings?
- Are ACP conversations revisited every six months for high-risk patients?
- Are we closing gaps for populations that have historically been left out of serious-illness planning?
